Abstrak

Perilaku ibu menyusui adalah serangkaian tindakan dan keterampilan yang dilakukan oleh seorang ibu untuk memberikan ASI kepada bayinya. Penelitian ini menggunakan desain penelitian deskriptif kuantitatif dengan metode cross-sectional bertujuan untuk mengetahui hubungan perilaku ibu menyusui dengan motivasi memberikan asi pada bayi usia (0-9 bulan) di wilayah kerja puskesmas maesan. Populasi dalam penelitian ini adalah ibu menyusui pada bayi usia 0-9 bulan di wilayah kerja Puskesmas maesan yang berjumlah 100 orang. Teknik pengambilan sampel menggunakan *Simple Random Sampling*. Penilaian menggunakan kuesioner terkait perilaku ibu menyusui dan motivasi memberikan ASI. Hasil penelitian dengan uji Rank Spearman Rho ($\alpha = 0,05$) menunjukkan adanya hubungan bermakna antara perilaku ibu menyusui dengan motivasi memberikan ASI pada bayi usia (0-9 bulan). Hasil penelitian tentang motivasi memberikan ASI didapatkan 66,3% motivasi baik, 26,3% motivasi cukup, dan 7,5 motivasi kurang. Hubungan Perilaku Ibu Menyusui Dengan Motivasi Memberikan ASI Pada Bayi Usia (0-9 Bulan) dengan uji *Rank Spearman Rho* didapatkan hasil p value sebesar 0,00. Kesimpulan penelitian ini bahwa Ada hubungan perilaku ibu menyusui dengan motivasi memberikan ASI pada bayi usia (0-9 bulan) di wilayah kerja Puskesmas Maesan, Hasil penelitian ini dapat dijadikan acuan puskesmas dalam merancang program edukasi dan intervensi yang berfokus pada perilaku memberikan asi dengan motivasi memberikan ASI.

The Relationship Between Breastfeeding Behavior of Mothers and Motivation for Giving Breast Milk to Babies Aged (0-9 Months) in the Maesan Community Health Center Working Area, 2024

Abstract

Nursing mother's behavior is a series of actions and skills carried out by a mother to provide breast milk to her baby. This research uses a quantitative descriptive research design with a cross-sectional method aimed at finding out the relationship between the behavior of breastfeeding mothers and the motivation to provide breast milk to babies aged (0-9 months) in the working area of the Maesan Community Health Center. The population in this study was breastfeeding mothers of babies aged 0-9 months in the Maesan Community Health Center working area, totaling 100 people. The sampling technique uses Simple Random Sampling. The assessment uses a questionnaire regarding breastfeeding mothers' behavior and motivation to provide breast milk. The results of research using the Spearman Rho Rank test ($\alpha = 0.05$) show that there is a significant relationship between breastfeeding mother's behavior and motivation to provide breast milk to babies aged 0-9 months. The results of research on motivation to provide breast milk showed 66.3% good motivation, 26.3% sufficient motivation, and 7.5 poor motivation. Relationship between Mother's Breastfeeding Behavior and Motivation for Giving Breast Milk to Babies Aged (0-9 Months) with tests Rank Spearman Rho The result was a p value of 0.00. The conclusion of this study is that there is a relationship between the behavior of breastfeeding mothers and the motivation to provide breast milk to infants aged (0-9 months) in the working area of the Maesan Health Center. The results of this study can be used as a reference for health centers in designing educational and intervention programs that focus on breastfeeding behavior with breastfeeding motivation.
