### **Abstrak**

Kecemasan yang dialami oleh anak saat hospitalisasi dapat mengakibatkan anak menjadi agresif dan hal ini dapat mengganggu perkembangan emosional pada anak (Akmalia et al., 2021). Salah satu pendekatan yang dapat dilakukan yaitu *Family Centered Care* (FCC), faktor yang mempengaruhi dalam penerapan *Family Centered Care* ini adalah kompetensi perawat. Tujuan penelitian ini menganalisis hubungan kompetensi perawat dalam menerapkan *Family Centered Care* di RSD dr. Soebandi Jember. Penelitian ini merupakan penelitian kuantitatif dengan desain korelasional dan pendekatan *cross sectional*. Populasi adalah seluruh perawat yang pernah melakukan perawatan pada anak di Rumah Sakit Daerah dr. Soebandi Jember sebanyak 50 perawat dan 50 keluarga pasien yang di rawat ruangan anak serta ruangan kelas 1 dan semuanya dijadikan sampel penelitian. Uji Statistik yang digunakan yakni *Spearman Rank (Rho)* dengan taraf signifikan  $\alpha=5\%$  (0,05). Hasil penelitian menunjukkan nilai  $\rho 0,001 < 0,05$ . Dapat disimpulkan bahwa terdapat hubungan yang signifikan antara kompetensi perawat dengan penerapan *Family Centered Care* dengan keeratan korelasi ( $r$ ) sedang dan arah korelasi positif, dimana semakin baik kompetensi perawat maka akan disertai dengan penerapan *family centered care* yang baik, dan sebaliknya apabila kompetensi perawat kurang maka akan disertai dengan penerapan *family centered care* yang kurang juga. Dengan demikian penelitian ini diharapkan dapat menjadi bahan masukan atau motivasi untuk mengembangkan potensi diri bagi perawat khususnya dalam penerapan family centered care (FCC).

## Abstract

*The anxiety experienced by children during hospitalization can cause children to become aggressive and this can disrupt children's emotional development (Akmalia et al., 2021). One approach that can be taken is Family Centered Care (FCC). The factor that influences the implementation of Family Centered Care is the competency of nurses. The aim of this research is to analyze the relationship between nurse competency in implementing Family Centered Care at RSD dr. Soebandi Jember. This research is a quantitative study with a correlational design and a cross-sectional approach. The population was all nurses who have provided care for children at the Dr. Regional Hospital. Soebandi Jember consisted of 50 nurses and 50 families of patients who were cared for in children's rooms and class 1 rooms and all of them were used as research samples. The statistical test used is Spearman Rank (Rho) with a significance level of  $\alpha=5\%$  (0.05). The research results show a value of  $\rho 0.001 < 0.05$ . It can be concluded that there was a significant relationship between nurse competence and the implementation of Family Centered Care with a moderate correlation ( $r$ ) and a positive correlation direction, where the better the nurse's competence, the better the implementation of family centered care will be, and vice versa if the nurse's competence was less then will be accompanied by a lack of implementation of family centered care as well. Thus, it is hoped that this research can provide input or motivation to develop self-potential for nurses, especially in implementing family centered care (FCC)..*
