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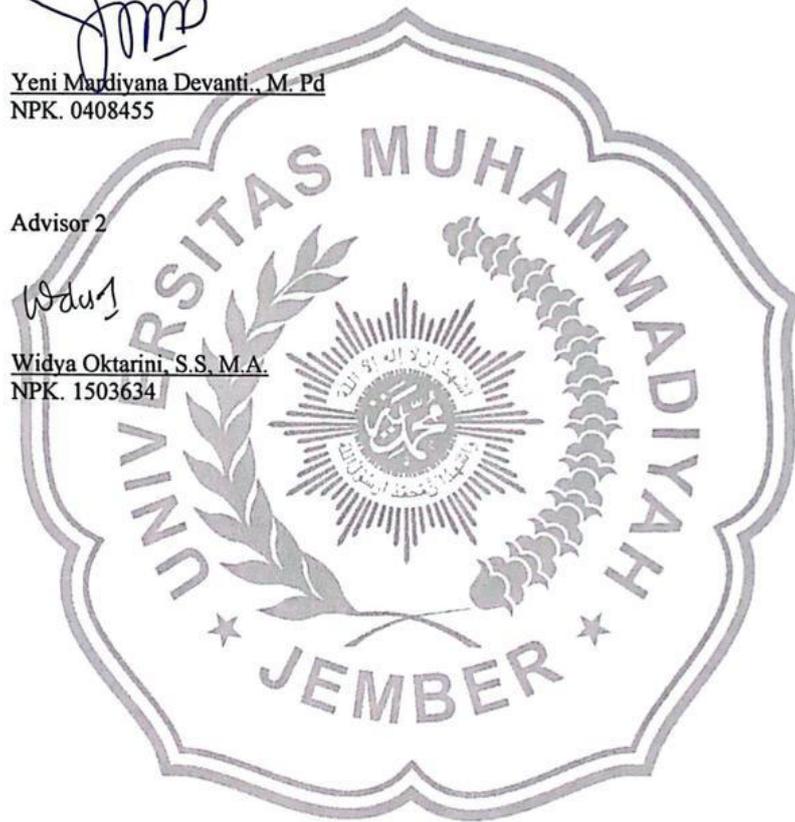


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PREFACE

May this thesis be beneficial and serve as a reference for future research, Constructive criticism and suggestions are highly welcomed for improvement in the future.

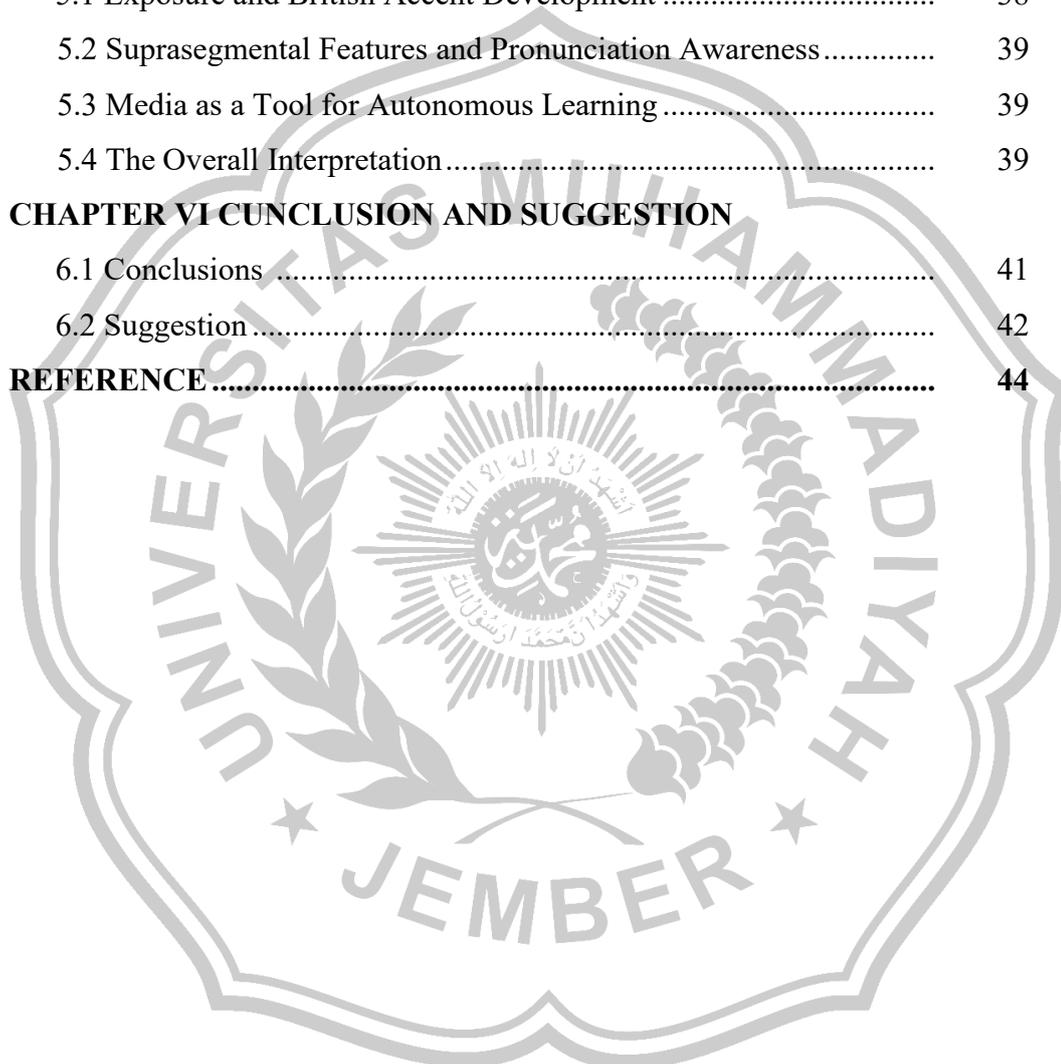
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
